Drone Attack on School Occupied by IDPs in Al-Abbasiya Tagali, South Kordofan State

On Saturday morning, November 1, 2025, a devastating drone attack targeted a school occupied by internally displaced persons (IDPs) in Al-Abbasiya Tagali, South Kordofan. The attack, attributed to the Rapid Support Forces (RSF), which was targeting the Sudan Armed Forces (SAF) garrison, has resulted in loss of life and injuries among vulnerable civilians, including women and children.

We strongly condemn this attack on civilian populations, which constitutes a grave violation of international humanitarian law. Such senseless acts of violence are unacceptable and must be stopped immediately.

We call for:

- Immediate cessation of hostilities: All parties involved must cease military operations and respect the safety and dignity of civilians.
- Protection of civilians: IDP camps and schools must be protected from attacks, and all measures should be taken to prevent harm to innocent lives.
- Humanitarian access: Unimpeded access must be granted to humanitarian organizations to provide assistance to those affected.
- The international community must hold perpetrators accountable for these egregious acts, ending the culture of impunity and working towards a peaceful resolution to the conflict.

We extend our deepest condolences to the families of the victims and wish a speedy recovery to those injured.
